SPOTLIGHT: DAVIESS COUNTY

Getting information to clients during a pandemic



To provide the community with information and program activities through the COVID-19 pandemic, the majority of the state started using Grab and Go kits. Daviess County Family and Consumer Sciences followed suit and gave out Grab and Go kits over the course of 12 weeks. The Family and Consumer Sciences Extension agent collaborated with our SNAP assistant and a local greenhouse to put out Grab and Go kits on various topics including gardening, nutrition, food safety and cooking, physical activity, self-care, outdoor fun and safety, and pet safety around the holidays. Over the course of 12 weeks, we reached 151 adults and 293 children in Daviess County. Participants reported enjoying the bags and thanked our office for sharing them.
