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SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

The Daviess County 4-H Council sponsors a scholarship of up to \$1000 for 4-H'ers who will be entering college or technical school next fall or who are already in college but have not received a 4-H scholarship in the past. The application for the Daviess County 4-H Council Scholarship requires a completed 4-H Achievement Application. Read below for more information. The 4-H Scholarship Application is due *March 1*. Do not wait until the last minute—this will take some time!!

The 4-H Achievement Program is intended to recognize 4-H participants with outstanding accomplishments and to provide an incentive for youth to increase their knowledge, skills, and abilities. It is a comprehensive program spanning the entire career of the 4-H'er, awards points for outside efforts and interests, and encourages growth and development by awarding high points at multi-county, state, and national levels. As youth work their way through the achievement levels they become eligible for scholarships to teen summit, teen conference, and eventually college scholarships. The 4-H program year runs from September 1 to August 31 of the next year. Youth who are age 9 as of January 1 of that program year may start documenting their 4-H achievements, participation, and projects to go toward their 4-H Achievement Application. 4-H JACKET & VEST AWARD

Each year the Daviess County 4-H Council awards one embroidered fleece vest to a junior 4-H member (age 9-13 as of 1/1/22) and one embroidered jacket to a senior 4-H member (age 14-19 as of 1/1/22). To apply, a 4-H member must turn in an Achievement Application by *March 1*. If you have already turned in an achievement application this year, simply call the Extension Office to let us know you would like to be considered for the vest or jacket. You may only win one time as a junior and one time as a senior.

4-H SHOOTING SPORTS CAMP

4-H Shooting Sports Camp is *April 6-9* at Lake Cumberland 4-H Camp. The cost is \$210 per youth and chaperone. Camp is open to all youth 9-13 years of age as of their 4-H age. 1 adult chaperone is required for every 5 youth that attends. The deadline to apply is *March 14*. Contact the Extension Office for an application.

4-H Shooting Sports Camp Teen Coaches:

Each year a small group of certified teen coaches is selected to attend camp and assist the adult coaches with range and classroom work, as well as help supervise campers. To be considered, a teen must complete the Teen Coach Application and submit 2 references. The Daviess County deadline to apply is *February 7*. Contact the Extension Office for an application.

Kentucky Red Velvet Muffins



1 1/4 cups whole-wheat flour

1/3 cup cocoa powder **1 1/2 teaspoons** baking powder

1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup sugar

4 tablespoons unsalted butter, softened Zest of one orange

Juice of one orange (about 4 tablespoons)

2 large eggs, at room temperature

1/2 cup unsweetened applesauce

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1 cup finely chopped cooked beets

1/2 cup semisweet chocolate chips

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Line 12 muffin cups with paper liners. Mix flour, cocoa, baking powder, and salt together in a medium bowl. In a separate large bowl, beat sugar, butter, and orange zest until smooth. Add orange juice, eggs, applesauce, and vanilla to the sugar mixture; beat until smooth. Stir about one-third of the flour mixture into the sugar mixture to fully incorporate it into a batter; repeat with remaining flour mixture in two even additions. Fold in beets and chocolate chips. Divide batter equally into the lined muffin cups using a 1/4-cup measuring scoop. Bake about 25 minutes, until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean. Cool in pan for 10 minutes before removing muffins to cool completely on a wire rack.

Yield: 12 muffins, Serving Size: 1 muffin

To steam beets: Scrub unpeeled beets and place in steaming basket. Cover and steam for about 35-40 minutes for large beets, 20-25 minutes for smaller beets, or until tender.

THIS MONTH'S TOPIC:

DENTAL HEALTH

mile Big! Do you brush your teeth at least twice a day? Yes? Good, because you should! Having strong, healthy teeth can help you chew the right foods to help you grow, help you speak clearly, and help you look your best. Taking care of your teeth is very important for your overall health and helps prevent cavities or gum disease.

Why should you brush your teeth? To clean them! Brushing and flossing are the most important things that you can do to keep your teeth and gums healthy.

How to brush your teeth:

- **1.** Wet the toothbrush and apply a small amount of fluoride toothpaste to it.
- Brush all teeth surfaces and your tongue for two minutes.
- **3.** Spit the toothpaste into the sink. Rinse out your mouth.
- **4.** Rinse out the toothbrush and let it air dry.

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Use a toothbrush with soft bristles. The toothbrush package will have the word "soft" on it.

Should everyone brush their teeth? Yes, everyone. From babies with one tooth, to teenagers with braces, and even your grandparents need to brush their teeth.

Be sure to keep these tips in mind to maintain healthy teeth.

- Brush at least twice a day after breakfast and before bedtime. If possible, also brush after lunch and after eating sweet snacks.
- When you brush, you do not need a lot of toothpaste: just the size of a pea.
 You can even choose from different colors and flavors of toothpaste.
- Use a toothbrush with soft bristles. The toothbrush package will have the word "soft" on it. Pick a toothbrush that is your favorite color or has a favorite character on the handle.
- Take your time brushing. Spend at least 2 or 3 minutes each time you brush. Use a timer or play a song you like to help you keep track of the time.
- Brush ALL of your teeth, even along the sides and the back.
- Get a new toothbrush at least every three months.





It is important to visit the dentist twice a year to check for cavities and gum disease. You can also ask your dentist to show you the correct way to brush your teeth so you do not get a cavity. If you play sports, like basketball or field hockey, make sure to wear a mouthguard. You can get a custom-fitted mouthguard from your dentist or just buy one from the store.
