

## Leadership Bootcamp Are you ready to take the next step in



## SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

The Daviess County 4–H Council sponsors up to \$1500 in scholarships for 4–H'ers who will be entering college or technical school this fall or who are already in college but have not received a 4–H scholarship in the past. The amount awarded varies upon the number of qualified applicants, but the most one applicant can receive is \$1000. The application for the Daviess County 4–H Council Scholarship will require the 4–H Achievement Application. Read below for more information. The 4–H Scholarship Application, found online at <a href="https://daviess.ca.uky.edu/4h-scholarship">https://daviess.ca.uky.edu/4h-scholarship</a>, is due <a href="mailto:March 1">March 1</a>, <a href="mailto:2023">2023</a>. Do not wait until the last minute; this will take some time!!

The 4-H Achievement Program is intended to recognize 4-H participants who have outstanding accomplishments and to provide an incentive for youth to increase their knowledge, skills, and abilities. It is a comprehensive program spanning the entire career of the 4-H'er, awards points for outside efforts and interests, and encourages growth and development by awarding high points at multi-county, state, and national levels. As youth work their way through the achievement levels they become eligible for scholarships to teen summit, teen conference, and eventually college scholarships. The 4-H program year runs from September 1 to August 31 of the next year. Youth who are age 9 as of January 1 of that program year may start documenting their 4-H achievements, participation, and projects to go toward their 4-H Achievement Application. ## 4-H DEMONSTRATION CONTEST

Demonstrations are a way to communicate an idea by showing and telling. Visual aids like posters, props, and samples are used to enhance the presentation. A 4–H Demonstration should be from 5–15 minutes long for both junior and senior 4–H'ers. If the thought of delivering a speech makes you uncomfortable, 4–H Demonstrations can be a good place to start. The posters and props give you some visual support and something to do with your hands! ## BEEF AND BROCCOLI STUFFED POTATOES

#### **Ingredients**

- 4 large potatoes, baked
- 8 ounces lean ground beef
- 1 teaspoon onion powder
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 10-ounce package frozen chopped broccoli
- 1 cup low-fat shredded cheddar cheese



- In a skillet, cook ground beef over medium heat, breaking up beef until coarsely chopped; cook until no pink remains.
- 2. Drain fat off browned beef.
- 3. Return ground beef to skillet; add onion powder, garlic, and frozen broccoli.
- 4. Cover and cook beef and broccoli mixture 8–10 minutes over medium heat.
- 5. Sprinkle cheese over mixture; cover pan until cheese melts.
- 6. To serve, place one baked potato on each plate; cut potatoes widely open.
- 7. Top each potato with one-fourth of the beef broccoli mixture.
- 8. Serve immediately.


## RSV: MORE THAN JUST A COLD


RSV is a virus that can be just like a common cold for older kids but can be dangerous for babies and small children. You've probably had RSV sometime in your life. Most people catch it at least once by the time they are 2 years old. Many children get better and don't get very sick. But babies, young children, and people who have other health complications can get very sick with RSV.

Kids in school catch and pass germs like viruses often. That's because they share spaces like classrooms, bathrooms, and school buses. These germs don't usually make you very sick, but you could pass them to a younger sibling or other small child.

If you have RSV, you might feel bad and have these symptoms:

- Fever
- Cough and/or wheezing
- Stuffy nose
- Runny nose
- Sneezing
- Headache

If you feel bad like this, tell your parent or other adult. Try not to spread your germs to others. Here are some ways you can stop the spread of germs:

- Stay away: Do not get close to babies or small children. Do not play with their toys or use their blankets.
- Wash your hands: After using the bathroom, every time you sneeze or wipe your nose, and before touching food, scrub your hands with warm water and soap for at least 20 seconds.
- **Do not share:** Keep food, drinks, or anything that touches your mouth or nose to yourself.





- Cover your nose and mouth if you sneeze: You should use a tissue and throw it away after.
- Cough into your elbow: Don't use your hands to catch germs. Using your elbow will not send them into the air.
- **Stay home from school:** If you have a fever higher than 100.4, stay home.
- **Go to the doctor:** If you feel worse or stay sick for more than two days, see a doctor.

We all get sick from time to time. But you can make good choices to help slow the spread of dangerous germs to babies and small children. As they get older, just like you, their bodies will get stronger. Then they will be able to fight off viruses like RSV.
