

All three of this year's 4-H Scholarship Winners have many 4-H experiences in common. They are all seasoned 4-H Campers who combined have 25 years of 4-H Camp experience. From cloverbud age to regular 4-H Camp, as teen leaders and even as adult leaders. 


4-H CRUSHERS

ASPARAGUS HAM QUICHE

Ingredients

- 1 pound fresh asparagus, trimmed and cut into
 ½ inch pieces
- 1 cup finely chopped ham
- 1 small finely chopped onion
- 2 (8-inch) unbaked pie shells
- 1 egg white, slightly beaten
- 2 cups shredded reduced fat cheddar cheese
- 4 large eggs
- 1 container (5.3 ounces) plain Greek yogurt
- ½ cup 1% milk
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 400°F.
- Place asparagus in a steamer over 1 inch of boiling water and cover. Cook until tender but still firm, about 4-6 minutes. Drain and cool.
- 3. Place ham and onion in a nonstick skillet and cook over medium heat until lightly browned.
- 4. Brush pie shells with beaten egg white.
- 5. Spoon the ham, onion, and asparagus into pie shells, dividing evenly between the 2 shells.
- 6. Sprinkle 1 cup shredded cheese over the mixture in each shell.
- In a separate bowl, beat together eggs, yogurt, milk, nutmeg, salt, and pepper. Pour egg mixture over the top of the cheese, dividing evenly between the 2 shells.
- Bake uncovered in a preheated oven until firm 25-30 minutes. Allow to cool approximately 20 minutes before cutting.




