

NEW PROGRAM YEAR

September is the beginning of the 2024-2025 program year for 4-H! Enrollment forms are now available at our office and online at https://daviess.ca.uky.edu/4h-enrollment. We have also included a copy with this newsletter. All Daviess County youth are welcome to join 4-H anytime! 4-H is for youth ages 9-18. 4-H Cloverbuds is for youth ages 5-8. Youth/adults must complete a new form every year. Please look at the graphic below to know your 4-H age for 2024-2025. You must submit a new enrollment form to continue receiving the 4-H newsletter each month. Next month's newsletter will be the last one you receive until you submit this year's enrollment form.



COUNTY 4-H ENROLLMENT AND CROSS-COUNTY LINES POLICY

A young person may enroll in 4-H within the county where they are a resident or attend school. If a 4-H program is not offered in the county where the young person resides or attends school, the youth may cross county lines into a county that offers that program. The request of the member and their parent/guardian is made on a yearly basis through the 4-H agents and the local County 4-H Councils. If a young person pursues crossing county lines, *Request for 4-H Participation Across County Lines* should be completed by both counties.

ACHIEVEMENT APPLICATION

The 4-H Achievement Program is intended to recognize 4-H participants with outstanding accomplishments and to provide an incentive for youth to increase their knowledge, skills, and abilities. It is a comprehensive program spanning the entire career of the 4-H'er, awards points for outside efforts and interests, and encourages growth and development by awarding high points at multi-county, state, and national levels. As youth work their way through the achievement levels they become eligible for scholarships to teen summit, teen conference, and eventually college scholarships. See the enclosed flyer for eligibility of each level. Applications are due October 31.

LIVESTOCK CLUB MEETING

At the most recent Livestock Club meeting, President Jolene Raymer gave introductory information regarding this year's upcoming events including the Christmas parade and the upcoming North American Livestock Exposition.

Our program for the night was Biosecurity, led by Daniel Hayden, who raises cows and poultry on large scale farms. Biosecurity is crucial for farms with dense animal populations. Mr. Hayden asked the 4-Hers for examples of biosecurity they use personally because "regardless of whether everyone understands the concept of biosecurity we all use it every day."

Examples of biosecurity in poultry include sanitizing shoes between poultry houses, quarantining sick birds away from healthy birds, euthanizing any sick or injured birds to prevent spread, and ensuring that each bird has the proper growing space (.8 sq feet per chicken) in the house.

Finally, Stacey Potts led a demonstration of germ spread to emphasize biosecurity's importance.

Overall, it was a wonderful Livestock Club meeting! Thank you to our 17 members who attended!

TEEN LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

The Green River Area 4-H Teen Leadership Academy is a program designed to enhance leadership skills inside and outside of 4-H. TLA provides youth with opportunities to strengthen leadership skills and allow them to be an important part of their community's positive development. Teens in Daviess, Hancock, Henderson, Hopkins, McLean, Ohio, Union, and Webster Counties meet monthly from September to April and cover many topics to assist with leadership development and community awareness. 



CABBAGE ROLLS

Makes 6 servings. Serving size is 2 rolls.

Ingredients:

- 12 cabbage leaves
- 1 pound lean ground beef
- 1 cup cooked brown rice
- 1 (15 ounce) can tomato sauce
- 1 teaspoon garlic salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon dried basil
- 1/2 teaspoon dried oregano
- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 1/4 cup chopped green pepper
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 1 tablespoon cornstarch
- 1 tablespoon water

Directions:

- 1. Cover cabbage leaves with boiling water. Let stand until leaves are limp, about 4 minutes. Drain. When cool, trim away excess ridge on leaf for easier rolling.
- 2. Mix beef, rice, 1/2 cup tomato sauce, garlic salt, pepper, basil, oregano, onions and green pepper. Put 1/3 cup in each leaf, starting at leaf end; roll, tucking in the sides.
- 3. Place seam side down in a 9-by-11-inch baking dish.
- 4. Mix remaining tomato sauce with the sugar, pour over rolls.
- 5. Cover and bake at 350 degrees F for 1 hour.
- 6. Remove cabbage rolls from baking dish, pour juice in a saucepan.
- 7. Mix cornstarch and water; stir into saucepan. Heat and stir until mixture boils, cook 1 minute. Serve sauce with cabbage rolls.



4-H YOUTH DEVELOPMENT CODE OF CONDUCT (NOT FOR RESIDENTIAL CAMPS)

All 4-H members and family/friends associated with 4-H members must respect the individual rights, safety, and property of others and adhere to this Code of Conduct. A 4-H member may be prohibited from participating in a specific event/program if the participation by the individual poses a danger to the 4-H member and/or others. The following guidelines are designed to make all 4-H events safe, meaningful, and satisfying to youth and other attending. WHILE ATTENDING ALL 4-H MEETINGS, PROJECTS, PROGRAMS, ACTIVITIES, & EVENTS:

- Each 4-H participant is expected to attend all planned sessions, workshops, field trips, and meetings of the event, and to be in appropriate dress. Dress codes will be specific to individual events. Delegation chaperones and/or volunteers are responsible for ensuring that members participate in all aspects of the planned program activities.
- The possession and use of alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, and/or drugs (except for medications prescribed to the participant by a licensed physician) are strictly prohibited.
 Delegation chaperons and/or volunteers shall limit use of tobacco products to designated areas.
- Setting off fire alarms, tampering with fire extinguishing and other emergency equipment are strictly prohibited.
- Gambling of any type is strictly prohibited.
- Obscene, discriminatory, and/or inappropriate language, roughhousing, and insubordination are prohibited at all times.
- Respect toward others and facilities shall be demonstrated. Bullying, harassment of others, or destruction of property shall not be tolerated. Bullying and harassment can include the use of social media.
- Display of overly affectionate or inappropriate attention between participants is strictly prohibited.
- Technological equipment (including but not limited to cell phones, laptops, or mp3 players) shall not interfere with the program and may not be allowed in certain situations.
- Each County may adopt additional Code of Conduct guidelines

WHILE ATTENDING OVERNIGHT CONFERENCES, CAMPS, & EVENTS, THE FOLLOWING WILL ALSO APPLY:

- All participants are to be in their assigned area at curfew and comply with quiet hours, lights out, and other rules of the event.
- No member or volunteer may leave the grounds without the permission of the conference director or adult in charge. An adult shall accompany a 4-H member any time he/she leave the grounds. Adults shall notify another adult in the delegation before leaving the grounds.
- At overnight events, only Conference participants may be in sleeping areas. Lounges or common areas may be used only for working committees and social activities.
- Room service such as phone calls, food, laundry, or others shall not be permitted without chaperone permission.

Any violations of this Code of Conduct shall be reported promptly to the adult in charge of the delegation/program and to the person in charge of the event. The person in charge of the event shall have the final responsibility for disciplinary action. Failure to comply with the Code of Conduct by 4-H'ers and family/friends associated with the 4-H participant may result in penalty, including but not limited to, the following:

- Sent home from the activity or event at his or her own expense
- Barred from participation from future 4-H events
- Assessed the cost of damages for destruction of property
- Released to nearest law enforcement authority
- Termination of 4-H membership
